
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### **Business Briefs**

**US Travel Association** continues to advocate for hospitality on Capitol Hill. Currently, they are pushing for the <u>Hospitality & Travel Tax Credit bill</u>, which extends existing credits and establishes new tax credits that assist the hospitality and restaurant industry. # CARRYOUT ALCOHOL CEASES JULY 1 HEARING SCHEDULED

The Board of License Commissioners recently sent out a notice to cease carry out alcohol as of July 1st when the State of Emergency Order concludes. The BLC does not have the authority to grant a grace period to the Governor's order and therefore, you must stop the temporary sales which occurred during covid on July 1st. Under the terms of HB 12/SB 205 the Board must conduct a hearing and make a finding of fact. This hearing needs be advertised so that both the proponents and opponents can provide testimony. The hearing is slated for July 21st. After this hearing, the Board <u>may</u> be able to authorize carryout and delivery <u>i**f**</u> the Board finds in favor of the proponents.

# OPERATION SAVE-A-LIFE

Worcester Goes Purple Warriors Against Addiction

## Who should participate?

Any business, restaurant, bar or retail establishment that may have an opportunity to save someone who has overdosed.

## What is Naloxone?

Naloxone (Narcan) is a medication that reverses an opioid overdose. It cannot be used to get high and it is NOT addictive.

## What will you learn?

Participants will learn how to:

- <u>Recognize</u> opioid medications and the signs of an overdose,
- <u>Respond</u> to an overdose situation, and
- <u>Revive</u> a victim of opioid overdose by administering Naloxone (Narcan).

## Registration and Free Training

Participating establishments will receive a certificate of completion accompanied by the tools and skills necessary to save a life in the event of an opioid overdose. A lockable wall mount box, instruction poster,

Good Samaritan Law poster and one free 2 dose box of Narcan will be provided.

#### Worcester Wellness Weigh

Worcester Wellness Weigh is a *free* online program designed to help educate youth, adults, and families about healthy eating, physical activity, weight management, stress, and financial wellness. The program includes wearable technology and each participant has a "Physical Activity Coach" and a "Healthy Eating Coach" who works with them one-on-one each week to discuss goals, barriers, successes, and solutions for overcoming any challenges.

#### **Diabetes Prevention Program**

The Diabetes Prevention program is an evidence-based program proven to prevent people with prediabetes from developing type 2 diabetes. Participants learn about goal setting, tracking food and activity, increasing physical activity, improving eating habits, and losing weight. Research has proven that a 5-7% weight loss and being active 150 minutes a week prevents individuals with prediabetes from developing type 2 diabetes.

#### **Just Walk**

Just Walk is a *free*, self-directed, self-reported physical activity program that rewards participants for being active. Visit justwalkworcester.org and sign up today!

#### **Smoking Cessation**

This program offers *free* group smoking cessation counseling. It is offered online and inperson at rotating sites throughout the county. Youth and adult smoking cessation classes are available. Monetary vouchers are available for adults 18+ that wish to add pharmacological therapy (Nicotine patch, gum, lozenge, and Chantix) to their behavior change efforts.

#### **Healthy Lifestyle**

This *free*, multi-session program is designed specifically for individuals in recovery. Program sessions allow participants to learn about healthy eating, active living, and stress management.
